Sermon and Reflection.

The Ascension of Jesus is about God going away from us. And that is not bad. Our lives are filled with experiences of going away.

We wouldn't be here if we never left our mother's womb. Nor would our mother if she insisted on keeping us inside.

The Ascension of Jesus is a celebration of NOT staying inside. It is a celebration and a reminder to us to go out into the world, and to not be afraid. And the reason we are not afraid is because we believe – or try to believe -- that God is with us. That's God's promise: to be with us till the end of our days, to give us life to the full.

But that can't happen with Jesus still staying with his disciples then, or staying with us now. He has to go.

A child leaves home with some uncertainly and maybe even fear on the first day going to school. But when the child is successful, the child grows. If their parents are always with them, children have a hard time growing up.

We leave the certainty of self when we enter into the uncertainty of opening ourselves up to friendship. And when we are successful, we grow. This is true of all of life's stages.

When I was in primary school, I had a classmate whose parents wouldn't let him or his brother or sister play with the other kids on the way home from school. His parents wouldn't let him learn to ride a *bicycle* until he was 16, while the rest of us had already gotten our learners' license to drive a *car* at 15. His parents were overly protective. They were fearful for their children. But the results were disastrous: His younger brother was learning to ride a bicycle at 16. He put on the front brakes too hard. He had a bad fall over the handlebars and lost many of his front teeth. My classmate himself had a horrible car accident when he was 21. That was the first year his parents allowed him to drive. His younger sister was pregnant before she was 18. The rest of us, given the ordinary freedom and responsibility to grow up, did – mostly with little traumas, not major ones. Our parents let us go. God lets us go.

The Ascension is God saying: you can't hold on. Even God doesn't do that. You have to let go.

It's about Jesus saying to us: I'm leaving. I don't want you to be born again. I want you to grow up. And remember, like a good parent, in my own hands-off way I will be with you forever.

Perhaps we could ask ourselves as individuals, as families, as friends, a few questions:

How comfortable are we in trusting ourselves, in trusting others, in trusting God?

Do we take responsibility appropriate for our age? Can we let go?

Do we give our children the freedom to learn by their mistakes while they are young, or are we over-protective? Do we young people give our parents reason to trust us, and to let us go, and to let us grow? Are they afraid **for** us? Are they afraid **of** us? Are we afraid **for** them? Are we afraid **of** them? Why?

Do we believe and try to live Jesus' words and prayer for us in the Gospel reading: I will remain with them no longer, but they are still here. God, protect them so that they may be one as we are one.
