ACC ORDER OF SERVICE - 5th Sunday after Pentecost July 5th, 2020

Introduction: On a day like today July 5th, 2019 I was in a serious car accident together with 2 family members, the car was extremely ruined but by the grace of God all the three of us came out of that accident very much alive with very minor injuries for two of us in the car. On the very same day 2hours prior to my accident other family members about 16 of them got in a very serious car accident and 14 of them were seriously injured. In both two accidents no life was taken away. I remember walking out of that accident with so much gratitude. What I said was "Lord, I am grateful for providing for us this gift of life, all material things and injuries shall pass". I have never talked about that day but every morning since then when I get to see a new day i am reminded of God's grace, even when I go astray He still takes care of me and my family, He never leaves us. On this fifth Sunday after Pentecost let us be reminded that God is still with us, all that we need to do is believe in him, ask for forgiveness and He shall take care of us and never get tired of trying our best to act according to his will.

This is a communion service so prepare some amount of bread and wine/grape juice enough for everyone in the service and light up a candle during the service. Scriptures and Hymns are provided below. First reading: Zechariah 9:9-12 (NIV)

9 Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem!See, your king comes to you,righteous and victorious,lowly and riding on a donkey,on a colt, the foal of a donkey.**10** I will take away the chariots from Ephraim and the warhorses from Jerusalem,and the battle bow will be broken. He will proclaim peace to the nations.His rule will extend from sea to sea and from the River[a] to the ends of the earth.**11** As for you, because of the blood of my covenant with you,I will free your prisoners from the waterless pit.**12** Return to your fortress, you prisoners of hope;even now I announce that I will restore twice as much to

Second reading: Romans 7:15-25 (NIV)

15 I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. 16 And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. 17 As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. 18 For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature.[a] For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. 19 For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. 20 Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it.

21 So I find this law at work: Although I want to do good, evil is right there with me. 22 For in my inner being I delight in God's law; 23 but I see another law at work in me, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within me. 24 What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body that is subject to death? 25 Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord!

So then, I myself in my mind am a slave to God's law, but in my sinful nature[b] a slave to the law of sin.

Gospel reading: Matthew 11:16 - 19 (NIV)

16 "To what can I compare this generation? They are like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling out to others:

17 "We played the pipe for you,

and you did not dance;

we sang a dirge,

and you did not mourn.'

18 For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon.' **19** The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Here is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners.' But wisdom is proved right by her deeds."

Matthew: 11: 25-30

25 At that time Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. **26** Yes, Father, for this is what you were pleased to do.

27 "All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. **29** Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. **30** For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

SERMON: On Roman 7:1 Prepared by Rev Rebecca Mosley (*Feel free with you family to discuss or to have a moment of reflection on the questions at the end of the sermon*)

Over the past three months, most of us have had more time than usual, stuck at home with our families, or alone by ourselves. We haven't had the support of community worship, in-person bible studies, prayer time with friends. I do pray that this unique time has brought out the best in some of us. But I'm sure for some of us, our true colors have been revealed, and they aren't pretty.

For me, the real trial has been supervising online school at home, while continuing to work. Are there any parents with me on this? I recognize that this situation has been as difficult and frustrating for my sons as it has been for me. They've been bored and unmotivated, but still mostly did the work. They miss playing with friends their age. I should have sympathy for them. And yet, when I have found them on YouTube for the fourth time in one morning, rather than in science class, some days I have completely lost control. Their disobedience meant that my plans are changed, my priorities compromised. Damaging, hurtful words have spewed from my mouth, harming my kids' hearts and shaping their attitudes towards me in negative ways. These are the people I love most in the world. I want the best for them! I know that the life of Christ should be on display in me, especially as I interact with my family, and yet there are days when I have completely failed. My older son has even asked, "Mommy, is this what it means to act like a Christian?" Ouch!

"I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do, I do not do, but what I hate, I do!" (Rom 7:15) Have you experienced this Romans 7 truth too? I don't know what your weaknesses might be: too much eating or drinking or social media; too much self-absorption or fear or need to control; unfaithfulness towards or abuse of the ones you love? Sorry to take us down a darker path this week. But when we can own the truth, the truth can set us free.

Some of us might be thinking: "I'm saved! I thought that I was finished with sin! Isn't Paul talking about the experience of a person before she's come to Christ? Does this mean that I'm not really saved?" But there is a lot of evidence pointing to the fact that Paul was speaking on behalf of all of us, even mature believers who have walked with the Lord for a long time.

Nicole Vaughn writes: "Do you know any Christians who got a new body after they were saved? No? Me either. I still have my old one too. When we become Christians and Jesus comes to live in us, our sin is still in us too."

Paul's point is that knowing the law – knowing what Jesus would do – is usually not enough. We will never succeed in living a completely Christ-like life in our own strength. Verse 22 says, "in my inner being, I delight in God's law, but I see another law at work waging war against the law of my mind." There has never been anyone holy enough to live without sin every day. Maybe it helps to realize that this kind of struggle is normal, even for long-time Christians. But just because it's normal doesn't

mean it's good! I don't want to keep hurting my children with my words. Do you want to keep doing the things that your conscience condemns you for? Of course not! We decided to follow Jesus because we knew we wanted to follow the way of love and freedom. And yet here we are -- We're stuck! We just can't do it! Who will rescue us from this wretched situation? "THANKS BE TO GOD who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord!"

When we catch ourselves in the grip of sin, there is only One who will save us: the power of God in Jesus Christ, at work in us through the Holy Spirit. We recognize how desperately we need God! It's good to be humbled. This is the moment to repent and to fall on God's grace again, and be lifted up in Jesus' arms and placed back on our feet. Can you feel a sense of gratitude and wonder? Our loving Father still accepts us and wants to set us free from sin and destruction. Can you join me in this prayer? (*found in the audio*) Let my recognition of my sin and my tears of repentance lead me to deeper thankfulness and praise and joy at God's mercy and deliverance.

Questions to consider:

- 1. When you read Romans 7:15, is there a specific incident that comes to mind from the past week? Ask God to help you think about how this applies in your own life right now.
- 2. Have you harmed anyone as you have struggled with sin? Do you need to ask forgiveness from anyone, now that you are thinking about how sin has taken hold? You might even need to forgive yourself.
- 3. Thanks be to God for the deliverance in Christ Jesus! Can you accept this deliverance fully? What would it take to experience God's grace today? How can you rejoice and offer thanks?
