Children's story: Prince of the Garbage Children

We just heard an amazing Bible passage about Jesus. Sometimes, the things we read in the Bible can be a little bit hard to picture. A pretend story can help us understand it a little better – to get a picture or a feeling about what the Bible is telling us. So I want to tell you a little pretend story now.

Once upon a time, there was a grown-up Prince, who lived in a castle with his Father the King and his Mother the Queen. They ruled over a kingdom which was more marvelous than anything you could imagine. They had everything they could possibly want. Trees full of delicious fruit grew in the castle garden and flowers of every kind were always blooming. The castle was full of fascinating rooms, and held beautiful books and interesting toys and every kind of thing you would want to do. The banquet table was always laid with amazing food. The royal family could do anything they wanted – they had all the power they could possibly want.

But that was not the most amazing thing about The King and Queen and Prince. The most amazing thing was that they loved each other completely and joyfully. Each one thought the others was the most wonderful person in the world. Everything they did was to bring out the best in the others. Everything they did was with love. They never wanted anything that would hurt the others – or themselves – even though they might have gotten it. They never had a wicked or selfish or jealous thought because their whole world was filled up with love. Their love spilled out from the royal family to all the people in the castle and in the whole kingdom. Even the servants loved their work and loved the King and the Queen and Prince and had everything they could have wanted. And the loving Royal family inspired everyone else to be loving and respectful and thoughtful to all the people around them. It's hard for us to even picture a world like that! Maybe the closest I've seen in a movie is the kingdom of Wakanda, when T'Challa was prince.

The only sorrow the Prince felt was when he got news of another, distant, Kingdom named Sheol. That faraway land had once belonged in their own realm, but it had been lost in a struggle long ago. And now Sheol was ruled by a King who was cruel and selfish and used fear to rule his people. Sheol's people were sad and hungry and no one ever had enough.

The Prince hated the thought of people suffering like this. He spoke with the King and Queen about it. "We have so much love and joy here! It is only right that we try to share it with the people of Sheol. Why should they suffer when they could know the same love as us? But of course, you can't teach people love and joy at the point of a sword. So, I will go and be one of them. I will teach them myself how we live here in our Kingdom." The King and Queen agreed with their Son whole-heartedly. They loved him for being a Prince who wanted to share their love generously with those who didn't have it. But they reminded him that when he got to Sheol, he would need to give up all his royal privileges and just live like anyone else there. He gladly did it. Imagine! Having everything, and yet feeling so free to just give it all up!

And so the Prince arrived in Sheol and found things even worse than he had expected. People were so poor and scared and untrusting! No one would even give him a place to spend the night or a slice of bread to eat. He looked at them with compassion, but they just couldn't trust anyone. And so he ended up at the city dump, the place where all the trash was thrown out, joining up with a group of garbage children. These kids had lost their parents and had never known love. They tried to survive by picking through the garbage, looking for rotten scraps to eat and small things to sell. It was a disgusting, horrible life. And they didn't even want to help each other! They lied to each other and tried to steal each others' territory in the dump and struggled for who was going to be in charge. They only had one rule: If one child found special food, that child could keep it and eat it.

The Prince realized that he had ended up with a group of people who needed love more than anyone. He tried and tried to talk with the children about how they could live a different way. He tried to tell them about his Kingdom – but they just mocked him. He tried to show they love. They said it wasn't possible. That was not how the world worked! A few kids listened, hoping that it might possibly be true. It sounded really nice. But the next day, they kept on lying and tricking the other kids, just trying to keep surviving.

One day, a little boy, one of the weaker ones, discovered a cake box in a bag of rotten food garbage. There was almost half a cake inside, and it was only a little bit moldy and only half smashed. It was the greatest treasure a kid had ever found in the dump. Like the rule said, he took the cake box back to his little cardboard box house and was going to eat it by himself. But then the biggest bully in the gang thought, "I'm going to have that cake. I don't care about the rule. I'm big and no one can stop me!" So he went and knocked over the cardboard box home and took the cake from the little kid. Other garbage boys saw him do it. They hated him for being the strongest and meanest and so they all agreed to go after the bully and punish him. The punishment for breaking the one rule? Death!

Our Prince saw what was going on. He rushed to the gang of garbage boys who were holding the struggling bully. "NO!" he cried out. "Killing this bully is not the right thing. Love each other! Respect each other! There is another way to live – where everyone will have enough. Please listen!" The other garbage boys got mad. They growled, "How can you defend this bully! The rule was broken.Someone needs to die!" And the Prince calmly said, "OK, kill me. I'll die for him." And the children killed the Prince, in a horrible, undignified way.

And it looked like that was just the unfortunate, stupid end for such a good Prince. It looked like he had wasted his precious life. But here is the mystery, and I can't really explain why and how it happened. The Bully realized that the Prince had died the death he, the Bully-thief should have died. Three days later, the Bully saw something secret that turned him into a different person. So did the weak little kid. The bully and the small kid became joined in what they had experienced and become dear friends. Something started to change in the garbage children, one by one. And those garbage children of Sheol, being changed, started to change their whole kingdom, like a tiny matchlit in a dark night. And here is where a pretend story cannot even begin to explain what happened in the real story of the Bible. So soon we will hear more about this story in the sermon. (Story by Rebecca Mosley)

Why do you worship God? That might seem to be a weird question, but actually there are a lot of different reasons why people worship God.

- Do you worship God because God is all powerful and all-knowing? Because he is great and strong and you are not?
- Do you worship God because you see God as kind of a strict teacher? Maybe you worry that if you don't do your homework (worship) you will get punished?
- Or do you worship God thinking that maybe if you do something for God, God will do something for you? Maybe God will answer your prayers and give you what you want?
- Some people just worship God because their parents make them, or because it is what everyone does on Sundays. So they go, even though it doesn't really mean anything.

Today, I want to begin at the end of our bible passage. Paul gives us a splendid picture of all creation worshiping God, and he tells us why they worship.

⁹ Therefore, God elevated him to the place of highest honor

and gave him the name above all other names,

¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow,

in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

¹¹ and every tongue declare that Jesus Christ is Lord,

to the glory of God the Father.

We see everything in creation worshipping <u>Jesus</u> as God.

things in heaven and on earth and under the earth – All creation falling on their faces and praising Jesus and worshipping him. We see:

- <u>Jesus</u> is lifted up to the highest place.
- God has given <u>Jesus</u> the name above all other names God's name.
- All creation declares that <u>Jesus</u> Christ is Lord.

Meaning that in every way, <u>Jesus is God</u>. Jesus has shown us the full character of God. When we look at Jesus, we see most perfectly who our God is. And so when we worship Jesus we are worshipping God in the most perfect way possible and for the best reasons possible.

Our worship of Jesus is what God really, really wants. God is not jealous – God wants this! Our whole-hearted worship of Jesus is to the glory of God the Father. When we worship Jesus, we are worshipping God in spirit and in truth, for the best reasons in the best way.

Paul starts this description of worship with the all-important word <u>THEREFORE</u>. Which means we must go back and look at WHY this scene of worship is happening. We find, just before this, an incredibly concise biography of Jesus and his life on earth. All his actions here are also a beautiful living out of what is in Jesus' heart:

⁶ Though he was God,

he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to.

Trying to squeeze this monumental passage into a 10-minute sermon is a little bit like Jesus, the Most High God, pouring himself out and squeezing all his divine being into the tiny space of Mary's womb. But that's what this is about. Jesus is fully God, fully divine, with power and privilege that blows our minds. Jesus was also filled up with all the love and joy that is possible as a member of the Holy Trinity. And yet we see him pouring himself out, making himself small. This process of humbling himself is not "**in spite**" of being God. Jesus humbles himself precisely **because** he is God, and <u>this is what God is like</u>. This is how God shows us the full extent of his love and compassion, his intense desire to save us.

In a perfect picture of God's character, Jesus pours himself out and agrees to be born as a human baby. That is a much bigger drop in status than the one we heard of in the children's story: A Prince becoming a garbage child. It's much more like a Prince becoming a pig. A Prince becoming a termite. That's how big the difference was when Jesus willingly was born among us as a human child.

Jesus could have been born as the privileged child of an emperor. But no, he was born as the child of impoverished peasants. His parents were not even citizens of the empire. They were from a small marginalized tribe, a people without rights or power. When Jesus humbled himself, He took a nosedive from the very top level of status and divine privilege to the very bottom of the social ladder.

Everything Jesus did in his life, he did in complete obedience to God. He had poured himself out of all his privileges. Personally, I believe that Jesus also gave up any special divine powers when he came to live among us. He only had the same spiritual power than any of

us have – the power to pray to God the Father and wait in trust for the Holy Spirit to work. Jesus did not have special divine knowledge or ability. He had tremendous faith and a closeness to his Father. He listened well and he followed the will of the Father at every difficult, excruciating step, right up to the cross. That was his power.

What is the meaning of this loving faithful obedience, this willingness to die a criminal's death on a cross? – it's a mystery that is not fully explained in our passage. But it is the climax of Jesus' life, showing perfectly in every way the character of our God of love. Jesus on the cross is an explosion of power that ripples forward into history, bending the knees of all creation, loosening every tongue to declare that Jesus alone is worthy of worship.

And Jesus' loving death on the cross – his attitude of humble obedience – ripples out to us! If we worship God in Jesus, then we worship rightly! We worship God, not because he is great and powerful, but because Jesus was small and humble. We worship God because Jesus gave up everything to save us. We worship God because Jesus was willing to become like the least among us, and so those of us who are least are lifted with Jesus to the highest places. We worship God because Jesus is Lord, and we are humbled and awed and grateful that this is who our God is. Truly there is no one like our God.

I think Christians sometimes, somehow worship the wrong God. Some worship the God of power and might, the punishing God, the God who might just give us something if we ask nicely. And that leaves us living like garbage children, living in a city dump, lying and cheating each other, stealing and fighting for survival. How else can we explain the bad behavior, the fighting and power games of so many so-called Christians, even bishops and important religious people. They just have not yet seen the truth of God's nature, perfectly revealed in Jesus.

When I get discouraged by the failures of the church, the evil done by people who call themselves Christians, that's when I really need this passage. I love this passage. I remember that this is who our God really is. I remember the beauty of Jesus, I am humbled and grateful for his love for us. I find myself back in a place where I can worship truly.

And when we worship truly, when we open our eyes to the true God worthy of right worship, it changes how we live. The first part of the passage makes sense! We have encouragement from belonging to Christ! We have comfort from his love! We have fellowship together in the Spirit! Our hearts become tender and compassionate in the light of right worship. And this gives us the power to live with the same attitude of Christ Jesus: We can agree wholeheartedly with each other, love one another, and work together with one mind and purpose. We can stop being selfish or just trying to impress others. Because Jesus did it before us, we can have the courage to be humble and to think of others as better than ourselves. We can stop looking out only for our own interests, but take an interest in others, too.

So thanks be to God who showed us the fullest extent of his love and compassion through the life and death and resurrection of his Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.
