LETTER FROM THE ACC CHURCH COUNCIL

THE FEAR OF DEATH



At the graveside of Jesus' friend Lazarus, He told grieving sisters Mary and Martha, "Your brother will rise again," and "He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live, and whoever believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"

These words are especially comforting for those of us in sorrow from the death of loved friends such as those we have lost among our ACC brethren this past year. Jesus stands with us in our grief. He understands grief. He wept with the sisters of Lazarus, and so today He also is touched with our feelings of loss, or fear of death. As we place our trust in Him, He cares for us in our sorrow. How it has helped me to know that the saints we loved and mourn await us on 'another shore' where there is no crying, pain, hunger, or want.

The message of Easter we celebrate this April is that Jesus gave His life for our sins, and was raised from the dead, adequate proof that He holds the keys to enter the Kingdom just as He said. Jesus further stated that He will not deny entry to anyone who believes in Him, who believes what He did for us (John 3:16). Haleluya! What is going to take us also from death into eternity will not be our excellent character, nor our generous giving, nor attendance at church, nor good works for the poor. While all are commendable, placing our trust in Jesus Christ alone can provide us the assurance of resurrection to eternal life.

For those who do not believe in the resurrection after death, you are not alone. During Jesus' time there were the Sadducees in particular, and even the disciples before He showed Himself to them after his resurrection. Only afterwards did they believe. This fact empowered them to become not just followers but leaders in a movement to spread this good news which today numbers over 2 billion followers.

There is no better time to choose to believe. Do it today, and be saved. Faith in the one true God will give us assurance when we breathe our last breath, when we pass from death to life and our heavenly, eternal home. At that time we will see that our time on earth was just a fleeting moment. When we trust in Christ, fear is gone of what lies beyond the grave. He who holds the future is there. He has prepared a place for us. Unending joy will be ours forever. We can exclaim with Paul, "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" (1 Corinthians 15:55). Consider this: immediately following our death will be glory. Jesus said, "Today you will be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:43)


Due to income shortfall so far (TSh 2.67 M), ACC has neither spent significantly

on internal ministries, nor started funding external ministries this year.

In early 2020, in response to the emergence of Covid-19, the ACC Council voted to keep our community safer by implementing a variety of measures designed to prevent the spread of communicable viruses. These included changes to Holy Communion and the offertory, not using physical hymnals and bibles, wearing face masks, spacing out of chairs and a variety of other measures. ACC even remained physically closed for a number of months at one stage, with the sanctuary being given over to ALMC for their use at that time.

Fast forward to April 2022 and the world is a very different place. Many countries are now opening up, including Tanzania which recently removed the requirement for visitors to present a negative PCR test on arrival. And whilst we continue to pray for those countries where people are still falling ill, here in Tanzania case rates are low and we are confident that the worst is behind us. With this in mind, and remaining cognizant of the fact that we need to stay vigilant to possible spikes of Covid-19, we give thanks to God that the ACC Council has recently felt confident enough to loosen some of these restrictions. Through March we have seen the offertory baskets being passed around the church again and the hymnals and bibles reappearing on the seats before services. And we can now announce that, **from Sunday**, 3rd April, face coverings will be optional for all of us in church. We do ask people to continue to wash their hands on arrival and we will continue with wide chair spacing and receiving Holy Communion outdoors for now.

We all know people who were affected by Covid-19 and even some who passed on. Let us remain vigilant and safe, let us continue to pray for and look after each other, and let us never forget those who were lost to this virus. But when all is said and done, we give glory to God for seeing us through and bringing us to this point. — Michael Murray, ACC Council Chair
